On Saturday 12th of June, pupils were dropped off at Llanmadoc at 9am by parents.

After stretching and dusting ourselves off. Mrs. Steel and her trusted volunteers, Mrs. Fussell in charge of the mini bus, but with Miss. J. Evans at the helm giving directions, we made some amazing rally manoeuvres and got so close to one driver in a van we could have eaten his sandwiches!

Thank goodness for the mindful mower - whoever they were!




## Mr. Heaher Rides the Waves


It was super exciting to preview the video to a GLOBAL audience including university lecturers, teachers and designers through Cardiff University on 16th June!





# Penyrheol Celebrate PRIDE



We really hope (in the not-too-distant future) to re-sart a the club for all year groups when restrictions end.




